- * **Caribbean Dance** - The class will explore various styles of Caribbean dance, African dance, Dancehall, Latin Dance, and Land Ship, to name a few, with cultural and historical information provided. As well as music, including Reggae, Soca and various traditional Caribbean movement and music.
- 1 **Solid Works for Beginners Club** - A Solid Works introductory club, teaching the basic skills of 3D modelling and rendering using CAD. The output of a selection of small projects created through this unit will be prototypes printed via the 3D printer.
- 2 **Company Programme** - Under the guidance of volunteer business advisers, students form and operate a mini-company as they would in the real world, to develop their entrepreneurship, teamwork and leadership. Students raise capital, elect officers, produce and market real products or services, keep records, conduct shareholders' meetings, and liquidate at the end of the programme. The JA Company Programme Trade Fair held in mid-December is one of the key events under the programme, in which students put their creativity and business acumen into action by launching their products or services in the real marketplace.
NOTE: This CCA is a year long one. We will start in September to April. Students have to commit for the entire duration (8 months). No new students will be accepted after the first few meetings.
- 3 **EPL Fantasy Football** - Ever wanted to manage your own football team? To buy and sell players to make your dream team? Now is your chance! You will be given 100 million pounds to make a squad of 15 players. Choose from those 15 to make your starting 11 each week and compete with your friends to see whose team scores the most points each week. Squads, points and standings will be tracked via the premier league website.
- 4 **Jr Model United Nations / Model United Nations - Jr MUN:** Academic simulation of the United Nations to educate participants about current events and diplomacy in international relations. Delegates role play as representatives of their assigned countries. There is a focus on research, debating & supporting resolutions of country members of the United Nations. JrMUN attends conferences locally and regionally. **Model United Nations** is a simulation of the United Nations. Students take on the rolls of members of the UN and prep for mock UN style debates against other schools both within HK and abroad.
- 5 **Math Club** - This club is for students who either want extra help with math, or just want to come and do fun math problems together.
- 6 **Mindfulness and Movement** - Using 'GoNoodle' (an online resource), students will be guided through a variety of breathing exercises and relaxation techniques as well as physical movement and guided dance routines. The purpose is to develop focussing skills as well as participation in fun group physical movement.
- 7 **Theatre Costuming - Primary Production** - This CCA meets the CAS requirements. This CCA supports the development and production of costumes for the Primary Production. It will involve storyboarding, construction and assembling of character outfits in keeping with the director's vision of the production. All that is needed is an interest to create and a commitment to the term of the CCA. This CCA runs across Term 1 and Term 2 and students enrolling will be expected to attend a majority of the CCA dates to meet CAS requirements.
- 8 **Baking Bad** - NO BAKING INVOLVED. This CCA is for students who have a passion for international cooking. We will cook foods from different countries ranging from South Asia all the way ot Aeric and Europe. Students will have to bring their own ingredients for each class; the recipes will be sent on Friday by email. The aim is for students to create their own snacks for teh next school day or just feed their hunger after a long day.
- 9 **Just Dance** - This CCA takes place on Tuesdays AND Fridays. Students who participate are expected to attend both sessions.
- 10 **Hong Kong Battle of the Books** - In HKBOB, Year 7-9 students will read a set list of 20 books by a variety of authors selected from different genres. They will then work together to compete in a quiz show type competition with students from other international schools around Hong Kong. Competition will test both book trivia and teamwork. - 11 **Making Friendship Bracelets** - Create beautiful bracelets for your friends and family using different beads, materials and your own creativity.
- 12 **Mind Games** - Mind Games CCA will challenge students thinking and ability to problem solve through a range of fun and interesting hands on games and activities.
- 13 **Writer's Corner** - Calling all budding writers and creative thinkers! Join Writer's Corner to challenge your understanding of the creative writing process. Writers will participate in activities such as constructing creative short stories, poetry, and infusing various media into written expression. Come to a relaxed environment where we can enjoy writing without boundaries!
- 14 **Photography 101** - At times students will be taking photos around the school and around Siena Park. All equipment will be provided.

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¹⁵ **Chess Wizards** - for beginners or "experts", students will play against each other or the computer. We will have online and real life chess available.

¹⁶ **Chinese Homework Club** - The Chinese Homework Club aims to enhance and build on students' Chinese learning experience and learning within the school. The first part of the session will support students' homework and revision of what they learn during the week. The second part of the session will introduce some Chinese stories, handicrafts or games.

¹⁷ **Decoupage** - Decoupage (or découpage) is the art of decorating an object by gluing colored paper cutouts onto it in combination with special paint effects, gold leaves and so on. At the end of the course, students will have 3 pieces of Arts.

¹⁸ **DC Film Society** - The Discovery College Film Society seeks to promote the appreciation of international and classic film throughout Discovery College. In the DC Film Society, student members will research and discuss the history of film and explore classic films from around the world. Student will learn some basic theories of film and how to do film analysis. Each month, students will vote on and select a film to screen at Discovery College for the student population. We will also invite directors/editors/producer to have the sharing or talk. The DC Film Society welcomes all passionate film goers from Years 9 - 13.

¹⁹ **Law Society** - 1. The CCA will be a 'critical literacy' course that will not only prepare the students for the LNAT test, which many universities set as a requirement for entry to Law course in the UK - or the LSAT for the USA, but also to prepare the students for the sorts of texts, issues and discussions they will engage with in courses such as PPE.
2. The CCA will provide an introduction to the British Legal System and how it functions for the 'uninitiated'.

²⁰ **Debating for Champions** - This is an opportunity to hone your analytical and oral presentation skills through the art of debating. The senior team that will represent the College will be drawn from the students who participate in this CCA.

²¹ **Gymnastics: Floor Practice** - Open to all who wish to develop further or finesse their gym floor skills.

²² **SEAMC Training** - Training for SEAMC, and other maths competitions. You should join if you are interested in trying to solve interesting problems, often with new methods. This is compulsory if you plan to attend the SEAMC competition later this year.
