\* **Astronomy Interest Group** - We discuss modern astrophysics topics, watch astrophysics documentaries, and perform night-sky observations.

<sup>1</sup> **Current Events Group** - The Current Events group will research and discuss current events that have occurred around the globe that week. Part of the group's task will be to then create a quiz once a month that would be used in the Humanities classes.

<sup>2</sup> **Introduction to Solid Work** - Students will be learning to use a 3D Cad drawing package, shapes drawn within this package can be printed via the 3D printer.

<sup>3</sup> **Knitting Craft Club** - The aim of the club is to teach simple knitting skills so that students can make their own scarf or blanket. If students become very skilled, then we may be able to create some scarves to donate to the Cross Road Foundation for people in need for the coming winter.

<sup>4</sup> **Playdough Factory** - Always a popular choice in the lower years, Playdough Factory lets children explore and challenge their own creative thinking while secretly building all the tiny hand muscles and tendons, helping them improve their pencil grip and scissor control. Children will leave the last session with a booklet of photographs displaying their playdough creations for them to keep and share at home.

<sup>5</sup> **Science Club** - Fun science experiments: mostly chemistry, but some physics and biology as well.

<sup>6</sup> **Chinese Homework Club** - The Chinese Homework Club aims to enhance and build on students' Chinese learning experience and learning within the school. The first part of the session will support students' homework and revision of what they learn during the week. The second part of the session will introduce some Chinese stories, handicrafts or games.

<sup>7</sup> **Company Programme** - Under the guidance of volunteer business advisers, students form and operate a mini-company as they would in the real world, to develop their entrepreneurship, teamwork and leadership. Students elect management team, raise capital, produce and market real products or services, keep records, conduct shareholders' meetings, and liquidate at the end of the program. The JA Company Programme Trade Fair held in mid-December is one of the key JA CP events in which students put their creativity and business acumen into action by launching their products or services in the real marketplace.

**NOTE: This CCA is year-long; it commenced in September and will finish in April. Students have to commit for the entire duration (8 months). No new students will be accepted.**

<sup>8</sup> **Jr Model United Nations/Model United Nations** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in joining please see the instructors during the enrolment period.

<sup>9</sup> **Math Competition Club** - We will be working on preparations for various competitions such as Dragonmaths and Waterloo. Brain stretchers, puzzles, team problem-solving and fun Maths stuff.

<sup>10</sup> **Theatre Costuming/Theatre Make-up (Primary Production)** - This CCA meets the CAS requirements. This CCA supports the development and production of costumes for the Primary Production. It will involve storyboarding, construction and assembling of character outfits in keeping with the director's vision of the production. All that is needed is an interest to create and a commitment to the term of the CCA. This CCA runs across Term 1 and Term 2 and students enrolling will be expected to attend a majority of the CCA dates to meet CAS requirements.

<sup>11</sup> **Just Dance** - This CCA takes place Tuesdays AND Fridays at lunch. Student participants are expected to attend both sessions. Do you want to improve your dance technique? Here's an opportunity that you wouldn't want to miss. Join just dance, where you will learn a routine throughout the term that will develop your skills and make you a better performer. It will be loads of fun!

<sup>12</sup> **Battle of the Books** - Open to Y5 & 6 avid readers, we will be preparing students for the annual Battle of the Books competition (More info here <https://sites.google.com/site/hkbattleofthebooks/home>). There is a high expectation that students will read most or all of the books on the list in their own time. We will do practice question sessions and book discussions on Wednesdays at 1pm. Competition dates are: Semi Finals: Thursday 7 May 2015; Final: Tuesday 19 May 2015

<sup>13</sup> **Carnegie Book Club** - Every year the Carnegie Medal is awarded to the writer of an outstanding book for children and young people (<http://www.carnegiegreenaway.org.uk/carnegie/>). The Carnegie Book Club will provide an opportunity for students to shadow these prestigious awards by reading the books nominated for the medal, by meeting to discuss and assess the books, and to eventually vote for their favourite. The overall aim of the club is to encourage reading for pleasure.

<sup>14</sup> **IGC (International Global Citizenship) Award** - This award is an international programme that provides DC students with an opportunity to further extend themselves as responsible global citizens. To complete in the award, students participate in activities over 6 months in areas related to global citizenship – exploring other cultures, raising awareness about ethical consumerism and your ecological footprint and taking action to improve your understanding/impact in each of these areas. Activities completed for the IGC Award may also count as CE, and having the certificate in your CV or educational portfolio may be an excellent addition when applying for universities or employment.

<sup>15</sup> **Chinese Speaking Club** - Each week, there will be a specific topic. You will be introduced to the key phrases in each topic and by the end of each session, you will be confident in using the key phrases and be able to conduct a conversation within the set topics. This is a perfect chance for you as a Mandarin as a second language learner to improve and apply your Mandarin speaking skill.

<sup>16</sup> **Dance Fun** - Dance your lunchtime away! Come and learn some new dance moves and practise some of your favorite dances from last year. We will dance to our favourite tunes and some classics too.

<sup>17</sup> **Friendship Make and Create** - We will be doing different arts and crafts activities each week, with a focus on making things for friends.

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18	<b>Hong Kong Battle of the Books</b> - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in joining please see the instructor during the enrolment period.
19	<b>Lego Robotics</b> - Create amazing robotic creations and learn how to make them do different things... the only limit is your creativity! You are welcome to bring your own LEGO robotics sets to the CCA or use the school's LEGO robotics sets for your constructions. It is up to you how far you want to take it!
20	<b>Mandarin Cartoons Club</b> - Filial piety is considered a key virtue in Chinese culture, and it is the main concern of a large number of stories for Chinese. One of the most famous collections of such stories is The Twenty-four Filial Exemplars (Ershi-si xiao 二十四孝). We will watch 4 filial devotion stories in this club in order to have a deeper understanding on the key element in Chinese culture. This will help students learn Chinese words, as well as train their listening skills. Come and enjoy the show!
21	<b>SEAMC</b> - Open to students in Years 9-11 who wish to try their hand at competition standard maths puzzles, or attend SEAMC (South and East Asian Maths Competition) this year. Attendance is mandatory for those on the SEAMC team.
22	<b>Ultimate Frisbee</b> - Please note that this CCA takes place either at Sienna Park or at the beach by the DB main plaza. Students will be accompanied by the instructor when travelling to the beach, <b>but must cover their own cost for the public bus. Students will be responsible for making their own way home after each session.</b>
23	<b>Debating for Champions</b> - This is an opportunity to hone your analytical and oral presentation skills through the art of debating. The senior team that will represent the College will be drawn from the students who participate in this CCA. Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in joining please see the instructors during the enrolment period.
24	<b>FIMO Fun</b> - Students will use their imaginations and fine-motor skills to construct objects from FIMO. All objects will be taken home and used as displays or wearable art.
