- \* **Astronomy Interest Group** - We discuss modern astrophysics topics, watch astrophysics documentaries, and perform night-sky observations.
- <sup>1</sup> **Knitting Craft Club** - The aim of the club is to teach simple knitting skills so that students can make their own scarf or blanket. If students become very skilled, then we may be able to create some scarves to donate to the Cross Road Foundation for people in need for the coming winter.
- <sup>2</sup> **Science Club** - Fun science experiments: mostly chemistry, but some physics and biology as well.
- <sup>3</sup> **Introductory Course to Product Design** - Students will learn basic crafting skill through making a series of small everyday objects, ranging from key chainse to versatile boxes.
- <sup>4</sup> **Chinese Homework Club** - The Chinese Homework Club aims to enhance and build on students' Chinese learning experience and learning within the school. The first part of the session will support students' homework and revision of what they learn during the week. The second part of the session will introduce some Chinese stories, handicrafts or games.
- <sup>5</sup> **Groove and Move** - Come along for some movement and games connected to music. Students will enjoy small group and whole group dances and games and learn about following rules and taking turns. Most importantly, they will be exercising and having fun!
- <sup>6</sup> **Jr Model United Nations/Model United Nations** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in joining please see the instructors during the enrolment period.
- <sup>7</sup> **Sing Chinese** - Do you enjoying singing? We are going to learn some popular Chinese songs and sing out loud.
- <sup>8</sup> **Swedish** - An introduction to the Swedish language and culture through games and other activities. No prior knowledge of Swedish is required.
- <sup>9</sup> **Cartooning and Comics** - Learn how to create your own characters and the techniques to make your own comic.
- <sup>10</sup> **Outside/Inside Photography** - Aside from taking and editing photos, students will learn about the different parts of a camera and practise various techniques when taking pictures.
- <sup>11</sup> **The Bookworms** - Students will read 'Airman' by Eoin Colfer, 'The Star of Kazan' by Eva Ibbotson and 'Goodnight Mr Tom' by Michelle Magorian. The books will be provided and students will be able to keep them after the CCA. Students will be reading the books and discussing their thoughts and opinions.
- <sup>12</sup> **Battle of the Books** - Enrolment on Gateway will not be opened. No new students will be accepted. Competition dates are: Semi Finals: Thursday 7 May 2015; Final: Tuesday 19 May 2015
- <sup>13</sup> **Carnegie Book Club** - Every year the Carnegie Medal is awarded to the writer of an outstanding book for children and young people (<http://www.carnegiegreenaway.org.uk/carnegie/>). The Carnegie Book Club will provide an opportunity for students to shadow these prestigious awards by reading the books nominated for the medal, by meeting to discuss and assess the books, and to eventually vote for their favourite. The overall aim of the club is to encourage reading for pleasure.
- <sup>14</sup> **Chinese Cross-Stitch** -The course is offered to cross-stitch beginners. We will choose some traditional Chinese patterns to work on.
- <sup>15</sup> **Chinese Tutorial Class** - This club will provide supplementary support to students taking Chinese as a native language in MYP and DP. Extra learning materials will be given to students and discussions on homework will be done.
- <sup>16</sup> **Creative Jewellery** - You will be introduced to various jewellery making materials and techniques from wire, beading, clay, recycled plastics and wood. We will also be sketching illustrations and working like a designer to create very unique piece. This workshop is open to boys and girls.
- <sup>17</sup> **IGC (International Global Citizenship) Award** - Enrolment on Gateway will not be opened. No new students will be accepted. This award is an international programme that provides DC students with an opportunity to further extend themselves as responsible global citizens. To complete in the award, students participate in activities over 6 months in areas related to global citizenship – exploring other cultures, raising awareness about ethical consumerism and your ecological footprint and taking action to improve your understanding/impact in each of these areas. Activities completed for the IGC Award may also count as CE, and having the certificate in your CV or educational portfolio may be an excellent addition when applying for universities or employment.

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18 **Mind Games** - Mind games will test the students' thinking skills through hands on and minds on puzzles and challenges that will be fun, fun, fun.

19 **Activities Club** - Students will be doing all sorts of activities, from arts and crafts to drama, writing, making friendship bracelets, learning about the food pyramid, endangered animals, and more.

20 **Olympiad Algebra and Proofs** - The CCA has two sessions every week (Wednesday and Friday) except during the week of 27 April where they will only be a session on Wednesday, as Friday 1 May is a public holiday. Students may choose to attend either session each week, as both sessions will be identical.

21 **Bake Smart** - Do you enjoy eating the stuff you make? Do you want to learn how to bake? Each week we will be trying out a recipe whether it is a cake, muffin or biscuits.

22 **Chinese Reading and Book Making** - The students will read books and make their own Chinese books with pictures.

23 **Dance Fun** - Dance your lunchtime away! Come and learn some new dance moves and practise some of your favorite dances from last year. We will dance to our favourite tunes and some classics too.

24 **Hong Kong Battle of the Books** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened.

25 **Jewellery Making** - Design and make jewellery from wood, metal and plastic using a variety of techniques including laser cutting and pewter-casting.

26 **Lego Robotics** - Create amazing robotic creations and learn how to make them do different things... the only limit is your creativity! You are welcome to bring your own LEGO robotics sets to the CCA or use the school's LEGO robotics sets for your constructions. It is up to you how far you want to take it!

27 **Ultimate Frisbee** - Please note that this CCA takes place either at Sienna Park or at the beach by the DB main plaza. Students will be accompanied by the instructor when travelling to the beach, **but must cover their own cost for the public bus. Students will be responsible for making their own way home after each session.**

28 **Photography Club** - We will be exploring scenic and nature photography.

29 **Chinese Board Games Club** - The club offers interactive Chinese language practice in a learner-centred, low-stress environment. The games require the students to produce certain types of expressions, so students practise a variety of vocabulary, grammatical patterns, and functional meanings.

30 **Chinese Speaking Club** - There will be different themes each week. By the end of each session, students will be able to conduct a basic conversation within the topic.

31 **Fun with Playdough** - Students will use their imaginations and fine-motor skills to manipulate, explore and create!

32 **Storytelling / Role Playing Game** - A story telling game is a game where two or more people collaborate on telling a story. The game has rules and is led by a moderator. The others are characters in this fictional setting.
