- \* **Move and Groove** - Come along to indoor games and dances that require cooperation, creativity and fun.
- 1 **Chess Club** - For secondary students to learn or practise chess, whether you are just starting out or have played chess for years.
- 2 **Company Programme** - This year long CCA started in September and will end in April. Enrolment on Gateway will not be opened as no new students will be accepted.
- 3 **Discovery Circuits** - Fun movement activities that support gross-motor skill development.
- 4 **EPL Fantasy Football** - Ever wanted to manage your own football team? To buy and sell players to make your dream team? Now is your chance! You will be given 100 million pounds to make a squad of 15 players. Choose from those 15 to make your starting 11 each week and compete with your friends to see whose team scores the most points each week. Squads, points and standings will be tracked via the premier league website.
- 5 **Introduction to Swedish** - An introduction to the Swedish language and culture through games and other activities. No prior knowledge of Swedish is required.
- 6 **Jr Model United Nations / Model United Nations** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in participating please see the instructors during the enrolment period.
- 7 **Kapa Haka and Pacifica** - Kapa haka is the term for Māori performing arts and literally means to form a line (kapa) and dance (haka). It involves a combination of song, dance and chanting. This is an experience unique to the New Zealand culture and open to any students from Y4 and above. Also we will be introducing other forms of pacifica song and chants from Tonga and Samoa.
- 8 **Math Club** - This club is for students who either want extra help with math, or just want to come and do fun math problems together.
- 9 **Mindfulness and Movement** - Using 'GoNoodle' (an online resource), students will be guided through a variety of breathing exercises and relaxation techniques as well as physical movement and guided dance routines. The purpose is to develop focusing skills as well as participation in fun group physical movement.
- 10 **Theatre Costuming - Primary Production** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be open; this CCA runs across Terms 1 and 2 and students enrolled since Term 1 will be expected to continue to attend in Term 2 to meet CAS requirements.  
**Theatre Make-Up - Primary Production** - This CCA welcomes new students to join to support the development of the Primary Production. Students who are already in Theatre Costuming are welcome to participate in Theatre Make-Up in addition to costuming.
- 11 **Bake** - This is a cooking CCA. Students will be taught simple cooking skills. Students will be making chocolate oatmeal cookies, tacos, banana bread, pizza, scones, spring rolls and more.
- 12 **Be Healthy** - This CCA will provide students with basic health tips (healthy diet) and workout sessions. Students will train different muscle groups.
- 13 **Just Dance** - This CCA takes place on Tuesdays AND Fridays. Students who participate are expected to attend both sessions.
- 14 **Science is FUN** - Students will learn basic concepts through a series of fun projects, ranging from balloon rocket cars to lava lamps.
- 15 **Hong Kong Battle of the Books** - In HKBOB, Year 7-9 students will read a set list of 20 books by a variety of authors selected from different genres. They will then work together to compete in a quiz show type competition with students from other international schools around Hong Kong. Competition will test both book trivia and teamwork. - 16 **Cooperative Board Games** - Students will develop their communication, cooperation and strategy skills by participating in various team-based games. Board games provide the stimulus for this CCA experience.
- 17 **Homework Club** - This CCA aims to help students in any academic work they need additional time and support in completing or understanding through the use of reinforcing classroom concepts and expectations.
- 18 **Mind Games** - Mind Games CCA will challenge students thinking and ability to problem solve through a range of fun and interesting games and activities.

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**Primary Battle of the Books** - Enjoy reading? Come along and join Primary BOB. You will read a variety of different books and build on your teamwork skills, in preparation for a live school-on-school battle to find the "book trivia champion school". The BOB competition will be held in May, therefore this CCA will also continue into Term 3.

**Why not DIY** - DIY not only can save money, but it can help to save the planet through recycling. Creating and making things yourself also gives you a sense of pride and defines your personal style - it allows you to decorate a home that is not like everyone else's.

**Writer's Corner** - Calling all budding writers and creative thinkers! Join Writer's Corner to challenge your understanding of the creative writing process. Writers will participate in activities such as constructing creative short stories, poetry, and infusing various media into written expression. Come to a relaxed environment where we can enjoy writing without boundaries!

**Health, Fitness and Stretching** - Students will be doing different stretches and simple workout routines, as well as being given basic health tips.

23

**Rocket Science for Dummies** - Students will learn about the basics and history of aeronautics. Student will also build a rocket using yeast and spaghetti.

**The Artistes** - Students will try a range of arts including drama, dance and visual arts.

25

**Chess Wizards** - for beginners or "experts", students will play against each other or the computer. We will have online and real life chess available.

26

**Chinese Homework Club** - The Chinese Homework Club aims to enhance and build on students' Chinese learning experience and learning within the school. The first part of the session will support students' homework and revision of what they learn during the week. The second part of the session will introduce some Chinese stories, handicrafts or games.

**Chinese Reading Club (primary)** - The teacher will read a Chinese book during the first half of each session, after that students will have their individual reading time with Chinese books.

**Chinese Reading Club (secondary)** - This CCA is offered to Chinese Phase 3 students and above. We will read short stories and funny jokes. If you can, we will read more complex texts. Hopefully, you will enjoy the Chinese reading more, and help you to improve your Chinese reading skill.

**Dance Fun** - Dance your lunchtime away! Come and learn some new dance moves and practise some of your favorite dances from last year. We will dance to our favourite tunes and some classics too.

**DC Film Society** - The Discovery College Film Society seeks to promote the appreciation of international and classic film throughout Discovery College. In the DC Film Society, student members will research and discuss the history of film and explore classic films from around the world. Student will learn some basic theories of film and how to do film analysis. Each month, students will vote on and select a film to screen at Discovery College for the student population. We will also invite directors/editors/producer to have the sharing or talk. The DC Film Society welcomes all passionate film goers from Years 9 - 13.

**Lego Club** - Come and let your imagination go wild as you construct your dream house, dream machine, an amazing creature or your own new world. Work alone or with friend. Enjoy some creative free play.

**Lego Robotics** - Create amazing robotic creations and learn how to make them do different things... the only limit is your creativity! You are welcome to bring your own LEGO robotics sets to the CCA or use the school's LEGO robotics sets for your constructions. It is up to you how far you want to take it!

**Run 50 Club** - Make a goal and stick to it! Whether you were on the cross country team and would like to keep training or you're running for the first time, this running club is for you! Our aim is to run 50km between now and the end of term. Come along ready to go!

**Arts** - Students will be drawing, sketching and painting.

**The Kind Campaign** - The Kind Campaign is a movement that aims to create a positive school environment by spreading awareness and increasing engagement in kind actions. During the meetings, students will discuss ways to carry out random acts of kindness, how to promote positivity, as well as learn about issues such as depression and bullying.

**Gymnastics: Floor Practice** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in participating please speak with the instructor directly during the enrolment period.

**NEAMC Maths Training** - Ever wondered just what you can do with that maths you learned? Want to get better at maths competition style questions? Join this. Those selected for NEAMC this year must attend, but anyone with an urge to dig deeper into the interesting side of maths is very welcome.

**Storytelling / Role Playing Game** - A storytelling game is a game where a group collaborate on telling a story. The game has rules and is led by a narrator. The other players act as characters in the story.
