* **Chess Wizards** - Chess wizards is a great chance to play one of the oldest and most played games on Earth! Whether you're a beginner or an expert, come out and show your Wizardry!

** **Cooperative Games** - Mondays AND Fridays. Students enrolled are expected to attend both sessions. Learn how to play cooperatively and have fun with a variety games and sensory experiences.

¹ **Dance Fun** - Dance your lunchtime away! Come and learn some new dance moves and practise some of your favorite dances from last year. We will dance to our favourite tunes and some classics too.

² **Making Games with Python Programming** - Mondays AND Tuesdays. Students enrolled are expected to attend both sessions. Students will be introduced to the concepts of programming to make different text based games.

³ **Shutterbug Photography Club** - Students will learn the basics of photography and how shutter speeds, f-stops, and ISO can be used to improve their photography. We will practise taking portraits, action shots and candid photos to capture life around Discovery College. **Students will be required to bring their OWN cameras to the CCA to use.** Due to the nature of the CCA, phones and iPads are not to be used as alternatives to cameras. School computers will be used to store photos as well as editing.

⁴ **Survival Cantonese** - Mondays AND Fridays. Students enrolled are expected to attend both sessions. Do you want to discover your potential in learning other languages other than English, Mandarin and Spanish in our school? Have you ever dreamed of having daily conversations confidently with local people in Hong Kong? Do you want to "survive" in a local Cantonese speaking community other than DB in the future? If so, please come join our club!

⁵ **(SR) 1,2,3...Bake!** - A fun CCA to join with your friends to learn new cooking skill and delicious recipes! This will be a cool activity for students to participate in. They will be taught basic skills that they could use in the future.

⁶ **(SR) Basic Graphic Design** - This CCA will be covering basic knowledge on standard photo-editing programmes such as Photoshop as well as vector graphics programmes like Inkscape. It consists of logo designing, photo manipulation, speed arts, avatar making, become a graphic designer for a fictional company and loads of fun!

⁷ **(SR) Juggling** - Students will learn the basics of juggling and develop hand-eye coordination, along with other skills that can be applied to other areas of their learning.

⁸ **Inline Skating** - Come and learn the basics of inline skating. Activities will cater to beginners and progress to more complex maneuvers as skills develop. Students will need to bring their own skates and protective gear. This includes helmet, knee pads and elbow pads.

⁹ **Introduction of Kinetic Typography** - What is your favourite font? Get to know & explore the font and its creator (Typographer) that you selected and present them with an animation. Students are required to do their research. Students will use Adobe Illustrator and After Effect to make their presentations. If you are considering to take Design as your Major for your tertiary studies, this CCA may help you enrich your portfolio.

¹⁰ **Introduction to Swedish** - An introduction to the Swedish language and culture through games and other activities. No prior knowledge of Swedish is required.

¹¹ **Jr Model United Nations / Model United Nations** - Enrolment on Gateway will NOT be opened. Students who are interested in participating please see the instructors during the enrolment period.

¹² **Mind Games** - Participants will have the opportunity to challenge themselves with a selection of carefully selected games. Working either individually, with a partner or in small groups they will develop and apply a range of skills and strategies for success, whilst having lots of fun.

¹³ **Mindfulness Training** - Mindfulness techniques are taught over 10 weeks. The programme helps the students' inner development, developing skills like increasing focus and attention, empathy and increasing effective work production.

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14 Theatre Costuming and/or Make-Up - Primary Production - This CCA meets the CAS requirements. This CCA supports the development and production of costumes and make-up for the Primary Production. It will involve storyboarding, construction and assembling of character outfits in keeping with the director's vision of the production. All that is needed is an interest to create and a commitment to the term of the CCA. Students enrolling will be expected to attend a majority of the CCA dates to meet CAS requirements.

15 (SR) Science4Fun - Science4Fun is a fun and easy way to learn science! In this CCA students will be doing experiments like Magnetic Slime, Putty and Lava Lamp etc. By the end of this CCA every student will become a mini scientist.

16 Book Club - The BC@DC provides an exciting opportunity to share and enjoy books with peers from Years 3-4!! The club will enable students to develop reading along with comprehension skills, as books are shared and discussed. The club is student-driven and will involve hands-on tasks that support learning and promote enjoyment.

17 Chinese Club - This club provides you with structured support to improve your written and spoken Chinese. The Chinese Club aims to enhance and build on students' Chinese learning experience and learning within the school. The first part of the session will support students' homework and revision of what they learned during the week. After that students will do some reading in Chinese.

18 Chinese Newsletter Club - Club members will try to use Chinese language to issue DC Chinese Newsletter to describe our school life and the important events. Members will take different responsibilities such as interviewing teachers and students, translating from English to Chinese, writing & editing newsletter articles online.

19 Hong Kong Battle of the Books - Year 7-9 students will read a set list of 20 books from a variety of different genres. This CCA promotes wider reading and the fun competition elements will test both book trivia and teamwork. Students will work toward competing in a quiz show type competition with students from other international schools around Hong Kong. 20 Primary Battle of the Books - LOVE to read? Come along and join Primary Battle of the Books (BOB). You will read a variety of different books and build on your teamwork skills, in preparation for a LIVE school-on-school battle to find the "book trivia champion school". The BOB competition will be held in May, therefore this CCA will also continue into term 3.

21 STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Applied Arts & Mathematics) - Wednesday and Friday sessions are separate. [Students are welcome to join both, but each would require a separate payment.](#) Would you like to apply your science and maths learnings to build something, test it, play with it, improve it and figure out how it works? Would you like to take what you are learning in Science that one step further through activities that include robotics, computer programmes, design and construction?

22 (SR) Just Dance - Wednesdays AND Fridays. Students enrolled are expected to attend both sessions. Do you want to improve your dance technique? Here's an opportunity you wouldn't want to miss. You will learn a routine throughout the term that will develop your skills and make you a better performer. It will be loads of fun!

23 Creative Comics - We will look at the comic book genre and its conventions and how comics are created. Students will have the opportunity to create a back story for their comic character and we will collaborate as a group to combine ideas into one story using drawings and text. Costs permitting students will get a printed version of the comic book to keep at the end.

24 Mindfulness Matters (upper primary) - In this course designed by Eline Snel, students will learn mindfulness strategies to help improve their well-being, reduce stress and anxiety. 25 Secondary Chess - For secondary students to learn or practise chess, whether you are just starting out or have played chess for years.

26 Spanish Club - For students who have no previous knowledge of Spanish but are interested in learning about Spanish culture, food, music and language. This CCA should quickly enable participants to engage in simple conversations and understand a variety of interactive situations. By the end of the CCA, participants should be able to use the Spanish language at a level of elementary proficiency where they can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases.

27 (SR) Math Magic - Students will solve challenging and fun math puzzles and learn important math problem solving skills.

28 Lego Club - Come and let your imagination go wild as you construct your dream house, dream machine, an amazing creature or your own new world. Work alone or with friends.

29 Mindfulness Matters (lower primary) - In this course designed by Eline Snell, students will be taught mindfulness strategies to improve well-being and emotional regulation. It is also known to reduce anxiety and help children gain control of their fears. Students will receive a certificate after completing the programme. 30 Story Club - Student will explore stories in a number of different ways i.e story stones, books with no pictures, books with only pictures. They will develop their knowledge of story structure looking for differences and similarities in story telling styles. They will make story telling tools such as a reading buddy and generally have their love of stories nurtured!

31 Storytelling/role playing game - A storytelling game is a game where a group collaborate on telling a story. The game has rules and is led by a narrator. The other players act as characters in the story.

32 Zumba - Each week we will follow along with a new Zumba video to get moving, work on coordination and have fun!
