1. 2024 IBDP Results and University Placements

The DP Coordinator presented a detailed breakdown of the 2024 IBDP results. One student achieved a perfect score of 45 points. The DC performance is much higher than the worldwide figures in all respects. The mean point score is 35. The current approach to data-driven, targeted intervention and academic mentoring will be continued with an additional focus on enhancing assessment practices and the subject selection process. The Higher Education Counselor outlined the final university placements for DC students. The UK remains the students' top choice of higher education destination with an increase in the popularity of universities in Hong Kong and Continental Europe. Students have chosen a wide range of majors, with continuous growth in courses relating to certain professions. Top universities remain very competitive in the UK, US and Hong Kong. Congratulations to all 2024 graduates.
